General Rules

- Exhibits will be accepted in the Exhibit Building from 3 p.m. 6:30 p.m. on Wednesday, the week of fair.
- •There are no entry fees, and no preregistration is needed.
- All exhibitors must be Missouri residents.
- Youth Division exhibitors must be ages 7-13 and be ineligible to enter Department J Junior Show.
- Tot Division exhibitors must be ages 3-6 and be ineligible to enter Department J Junior Show.
- Classes may be created or subdivided at the discretion of the registrar.
- Exhibitors must identify containers if valued.
- Entries are judged according to merit. Judges will not be required to give an award if, in their opinion, an award is not merited. The decisions of the judges will be final.
- Only one 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place premium will be awarded in each class.
- \bullet Entries must be removed between 8 a.m. 11:00 a.m. on Sunday. They cannot be removed prior to the official removal time unless previously arranged. The Fair Association will not be responsible for entries left after 11:00 am on Sunday. Any entries left will not be returned.

I LOT 1 – CUT SPECIMENS

All specimens must be garden grown by the exhibitor. All specimens must include foliage when possible. Only one entry per class. Each specimen to be a single stem unless otherwise noted. Exhibits to be well groomed, insect free and no oiling or dressing of foliage is allowed. Exhibits should be in clear jars or bottles in proportion to size of specimen, no cans or colored bottles or jars allowed. Judged on blooms at their peak, clearness of color, foliage, size and form (according to variety), and cultural perfection. One First, Second, Third place awards will be given in each category, if merited.

Containers must be clean and be decorated and potted by the exhibitor. All plants must be well established (not freshly planted) and maintained by the exhibitor for 90 days or more prior to entering. Plants previously exhibited are not eligible for premiums. One entry per class, judged on abundance of blooms at their peak, foliage, clearness of color, size and form of plant(s) (according variety), grooming, and cultural perfection. One First, Second, Third place awards will be given in each category, if merited.
